NOTICE OF RACE

Organizing Authority is the Port Credit Yacht Club (PCYC), in conjunction with the Club 420 (C420) Association. The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the NOR means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the rules and By-Laws of the Club 420 Association and this Notice of Race, except as any of these are changed by the Sailing Instructions or any appendices to the Sailing Instructions
- 1.2. The prescriptions of the Sail Canada will apply. The full text of these prescriptions will be posted on the official notice board.
- 1.3. Rule 40 and the preamble to Part IV are changed so that competitors shall wear personal flotation devices, approved by their national authority, at all times while on the water.
- 1.4. Appendix P will apply but is amended as follows: P2.3 is deleted. P2.2 will apply to the second and subsequent penalties.
- 1.5. The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and the supplementary sailing instructions that will be posted on the office notice board located on the patio under the tent.

2. ADVERTISING

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supported by the organizing authority.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1. The regatta is open to all boats of the Club 420 (C420) class.
- 3.2. Competitors (skipper and crew) shall not have reached their 22nd birthday by December 31st, 2018. Competitors must show proof of age no later than Check-In.
- 3.3. Competitors (skipper and crew) must be members of the C420 Association.
- 3.4. Competitors and coaches shall register on line. Online registration will be available at www.regattatoolbox.com.
- 3.5. Skippers must present a proof of membership in a club affiliated with Sail Canada (membership card or confirmation of members from the club) no later than check-in or in advance by email to thomas@northnational.com. If not Canadian, club affiliation is not required.
- 3.6. All participants under 19 years of age on July 15, 2018 must submit a parent/guardian declaration, including a waiver of liability and medical authorization form signed by a parent /guardian. These documents can be completed during check-in.
- 3.7. In addition to scheduled regatta check-in, coaches are required to check in, both individually and on behalf of their teams, upon arriving on site.

4. FEES

- 4.1. Boat entry fee is \$250 CAD up to and including June 30th, 2018. After June 30th, the fee will be \$275 CAD. This includes all social events.

4.2. The coach registration fee is \$40 CAD. After June 30, the coach registration fee is \$50 CAD. The fee includes boat launch and docking, and all social events.

5. SCHEDULE

5.1. On Site, registration and Check-In will be open Monday July 9, 2018 from 1400 to 1800.

5.2. PCYC is available for practice Monday July 9th.

5.3. Schedule for racing days

 1030 – First Warning Signal

Wednesday July 11 830 – Coaches Meeting

5.4. On Thursday July 12, there will be no warning signal after 1430 and the awards will follow not before 1600.

6. MEASUREMENT

Each boat shall complete an inspection checklist prior to registration, which is shown in Appendix A

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available after July 4, 2018 at www.regattatoolbox.com

8. VENUE

8.1 The racing area will be south of PCYC in Lake Ontario.

8.2 There is plenty of parking and storage for trailers in designated areas

8.3 There are 2 public launch ramp for all coach boats located adjacent to the club

9. THE COURSE

The course to be sailed will be stated in the sailing instructions.

10. SAFETY

10.1. All boats must be stored at PCYC during event

10.2. All Boats must have a tow line in accordance per class rules

10.3. A whistle shall be attached by lanyard to the PFD

10.4. Competitors may be required to sign in/out each day

11. SCORING

11.1. Two races are required to be complete to constitute a series.

11.2. When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's score will be the total of race score.

11.3. When 6 to 12 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of race scores excluding her worse score.

11.4. The maximum number of races is 12.

12. COACH AND SUPPORT BOATS

- 12.1. All coach and support boats shall register and prominently display an identifier supplies by the organizing authority at all times. [DP]
- 12.2. All coach and support boats shall carry VHF radios capable of receiving and transmitting on Canadian channels. [DP]
- 12.3. All coach and support boats shall assist with rescue and course control as request by the race committee.[DP]

13. MEDIA RIGHTS

By participating in the event, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority and its sponsors the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any still or motion pictures and live, taped or filmed televisions and other reproduction of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.

14. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded as follows:

The Canadian Club 420 Championship will be awarded to the highest placing competitor
Top 5 Placing overall, Top 3 Juniors teams, Top 3 Canadian teams, Top All Female Team

15. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

16. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with a valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of one million CAD dollars per incident or the equivalent. The organizing authority does not accept any responsibility for verifying that a participant is insured.

17. ACCOMMODATION

- 17.1. PCYC will not allow camping.

The Skipper represents that he or she has not made any addition or alteration to the hull form, construction, equipment, type of equipment, placing of equipment, fittings, type of fittings, placing of fittings, spars, standing rigging, sails, battens and running rigging as supplied by a Builder except as allowed by the Class Rules. (Rule 1.2) _____

2. 26 ft bow line, 3/8 inch in diameter, that floats, has a loop in the end of the line and is tied at the forward most hole of the jib tack fitting or to the mast. (Rule 4.4) _____

- 3A. If US Citizen or US resident: a US Coast Guard approved PFD will be used at all times while afloat. (Rule 4.1) _____
- 3B. If Non US Citizen or non US resident: a PFD approved by r the country of competitor's citizenship or residence will be used at all times while afloat. (Rule 4.1) _____

4. Whistle attached to PFD by lanyard long enough for competitor to use. (Rule 4.2) _____

5. Boat has device to keep rudder connected to boat in event of capsize or turtle. (Rule 4.6) _____

6. Forestay (including any extensions which must be metal) is short enough to hold the front edge of the mast forward of the aft face of the mast partner when the jib halyard is released. (Rule 4.7) _____

7. Trapeze system, in addition to trapeze wire, has only one cleat, one or two sheaves, one handle and one ring on each side. (Rule 10.9) _____

8. Mainsail, jib and spinnaker were manufactured by the official Class Sailmaker and have the official Class patch. (Rule 5.1) _____

9. Skipper and Crew are current members of the Club 420 Class Association. (Rule 3.1) _____
